

Join us for free webinars this spring, held 12-1 p.m. on Zoom. A link to join will be provided via email following registration:


- March 29: Finding & Fixing Leaks Inside & Out. Hidden water leaks can start small

PARTICIPATE IN THE CITY'S REDISTRICTING PROCESS AND HAVE A SAY IN HOW YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD IS REPRESENTED



This is just one proposed map for redrawing the district boundaries. Your input is important in determining the final map.

You have an opportunity to share with the City how you think voting district boundaries should be drawn to best represent your community. The City is in the process of redistricting—adjusting the lines of voting districts in accordance with population shifts. Jurisdictions like the City of Santa Barbara redraw district lines every 10 years following the census. Your input is important in this redistricting process.

Independent Redistricting

Commission is launching in-person bilingual hearings and is deeply committed to encouraging maximum community participation from underrepresented communities in the City's redistricting process. Spanish language and ASL services will be available.

Fair, representative redistricting maps help ensure that elected officials will be responsive to the voters in their communities. Redistricting ensures every person has equal representation by drawing districts with approximately equal numbers of people – one person, one vote.

STEARNS WHARF TO CELEBRATE **150TH ANNIVERSARY**

150 years ago, Santa Barbara was an isolated pueblo surrounded by mountains. There were no roads into town, there was no railroad. When John Peck Stearns built the wharf in 1872. he not only opened the door to large-scale commerce and trade: he introduced Santa Barbara to the world.

Over the years, the birthplace of commercial diving has been battered by storms, scorched

by fires and even damaged by a waterspout. Through it all, the community focal point has persevered.

In honor of the iconic landmark's 150th anniversary, Stearns Wharf merchants will hold Wharf Wednesdays on the first Wednesday of each month. There will be anniversary specials and family-friendly activities. The commemoration will culminate with a special celebration and fireworks in October.

OAK PARK DANCE FLOOR RESTORATION PROJECT

The City's Parks and Recreation Department is pleased to begin a restoration project for the Oak Park Dance Floor. The dance floor will be closed through early April to accommodate the much-needed facelift.

Originally built in 1926 for a gala honoring England's Prince George, the well-loved community spot now hosts a diverse array of dance and fitness programs every week.

The dance floor has received minor repairs over the years but at 96 years old, it is time for a larger scope of TLC. The project will

include; comprehensive waterproofing and sealing, lumber evaluation, removing and replacing all visible framing including, benches, handrails and guardrails and creating a 1% pitch to aid in water run-off.

We look forward to reopening a newly restored version of this popular venue.
