<u>ADVISORY GROUP</u>	<u>NUMBER OF VACANCIES</u>
Architectural Board of Review Members need not be qualified electors* of the City at the time of their appointment so long as they are qualified electors* of the County and remain so during their term. Members shall possess professional experience in related fields, including but not limited to, landscape architecture, building design, structural engineering or industrial design.	1
Building and Fire Code Board of Appeals Member shall be a resident of the City or adjoining unincorporated area of Santa Barbara County, and shall demonstrate knowledge and expertise in specialty areas governed by the construction and fire codes of the City. Per Santa Barbara Municipal Code Sections 22.04.020 (H) (113.1.2) & 8.04.020 (E) (114.1.2), at least one vacancy must be filled by a member who is physically handicapped in order to meet the mandatory requirement that the composite of the board have at least 3 members that are physically handicapped in order to hear items that involve Chapter 11 of the California Building Code and Chapters 11A and 11B of the California Fire Code.	3
Citizen’s Oversight Commission May not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government. One appointee must be a member of the Hospitality Community.	2
Civil Service Commission Members must be qualified electors* of the City.	1
Community Development and Human Services Committee..... Members must be qualified electors* of the County of Santa Barbara, or employees of the designated organizations. One representative from each of the following specified categories or organizations: Oak Park Neighborhood; Westside/Lower Westside Neighborhood; Latino community; Human services organization; Homeless-related Services Organization; or Disabled community.	6
Community Events and Festivals Committee..... Appointees may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government. For this vacancy, we need one representative of the cultural arts.	1
County of Santa Barbara Library Advisory Committee Member must be a resident of the City of Santa Barbara.	1
Creeks Advisory Committee..... May be either City or Non-City residents, and should represent one of the following categories: Representative of the hotel/lodging industry; Representative with experience in environmental/land use issues (e.g., land use planning, environmental/natural resource protection/preservation, habitat restoration, water specialist, biologist, or hydrologist, etc.); Representative with experience in ocean use (e.g., recreational user or commercial fisherman, etc.), business, environmental issues, or public at-large.	1

* Resident of the City of Santa Barbara who is a U.S. citizen age 18 or older.

Member may be a qualified elector* of the City or County.	
Library Board	1
Members must be qualified electors* of the City.	
Living Wage Advisory Committee	2
Members must represent specific categories. One member who is employed by a local Santa Barbara area non-profit entity; one member who is either an owner or a manager of a service contractor subject to the City's Living Wage Ordinance.	
Mosquito and Vector Management District Board	1
Member must be qualified elector* of the City.	
Neighborhood Advisory Council	5
Members must be residents of the City of Santa Barbara but need not be qualified electors*, who must be a representative of one of the following neighborhoods: Eastside (no more than one appointee), Lower Eastside, Westside; West Downtown, or Laguna.	
Rental Housing Mediation Board	3
Members may be City or non-City residents, and must meet the definitions of one of the following specific categories; two Tenant Mediator member must rent or lease a dwelling with no ownership of residential properties; one Homeowner Mediator who owns and resides in a single-family residence with no ownership of other residential properties. <u>Non-City residents must</u> reside in a jurisdiction which contracts with the Rental Housing Mediation Program for services.	
Santa Barbara Youth Council.....	10
Members must be between the ages of 13 – 19 years old. Majority of members must be residents of the City. Other members may be residents of the County. Members must be students from the following categories: four SBUSD high school students (San Marcos HS, Santa Barbara HS, and Dos Pueblos HS); one student representing the public at large; and two students from a local alternative, community, or continuation high school.	
Single Family Design Board.....	3
Members must be residents of the County of Santa Barbara. One member must represent the public at large; and one member must have professional qualifications.
