- Make a list and plan your shopping to reduce impulse buying and minimize waste.

- If attending holiday parties, carpool with friends or family to reduce carbon emissions.

- Get creative with alternatives to commercial gift wrap like fabric, newspapers, or scarves.
- Choose recycled paper or e-cards for holiday greetings.
- Use energyefficient LED holiday lights to decorate your home.
- Opt for decor like pinecones, branches, and dried flowers for decorations that are biodegradable.

- If traveling, consider eco-friendly transportation options to offset your carbon footprint.
- Minimize single-use items at holiday gatherings and use reusable plates, utensils, and cloth napkins.
- Set up a compost bin for food scraps and other organic waste during family dinners and potlucks.
- Consider incorporating more plant-based dishes into your holiday meals.

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Donate excess food to local food banks or shelters.

- Make your own decorations from recycled materials or items you already have.
- Invest in rechargeable batteries. Place used batteries in a sealed bag on top of your blue bin for recycling.
