## IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE \_\_

Measure is a City Council proposal to amend City Charter Section 519 to modernize the City's public works contracting. If approved by a majority of the City's voters, Measure would amend the City Charter to allow the City Council to establish procedure for competitive contracting for construction or improvement of City buildings, streets, parks, playgrounds, utilities, and other facilities in any manner available to other charter cities in California within the full scope of its "Home Rule" authority under the Constitution and laws of California.
The City Charter currently limits the City to a single contracting method for construction or improvement of City buildings, streets, parks, playgrounds, utilities, and other facilities. The Charter currently requires construction contracts to be awarded to the lowest responsible, responsive bidder after a notice published in a newspaper of general circulation. There are limited exceptions for maintenance and repair and emergency work contracts. The current Charter authorizes the City Council to establish alternate contracting methods for water system projects. Measure would instead allow the City Council to establish alternate methods of competition for public works contracts for all types of public works projects.
Measure will amend Charter Section 519 to read: "The City Council, by ordinance, shall establish procedures for competitive procurement of contracts for public works and improvements not otherwise prohibited by law. The City may also procure contracts for public works and improvements by any procedure authorized by state statute." It will also allow the City to contract for public works under any procedure authorized by state statute. Measure was placed on the ballot by the City Council upon recommendation of the Public Works Director.

A "yes" vote is a vote to approve the proposed Charter amendment.

A "no" vote is a vote not to approve the proposed Charter amendment.
