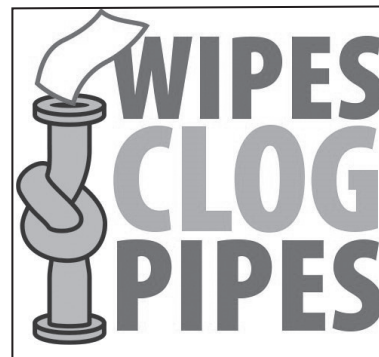


SB Clean Energy staff are ready to assist with home electrification questions.

ARE "FLUSHABLE WIPES" FLUSHABLE?



Throw alternative cleaning products in the trash.

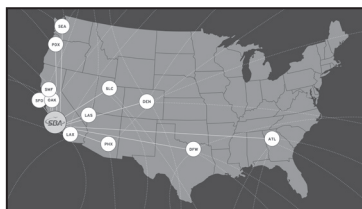
There are a variety of products on the market that are advertised as a better cleaning experience when compared to traditional toilet paper. While wipes are marketed in a variety of ways, such as "septic-safe," "breaks down like toilet paper" or "safe for sewer and septic," these products do not break down when flushed.

Flushing wipes can lead to costly blockages in homes,

businesses, and wastewater systems, ultimately leading to sewer overflows and pollution in creeks and the ocean. Wipes can also cause blockages in private sewer laterals, especially in older pipelines that may have grease, roots, and/or other existing obstructions.

Generally, sewer systems work on a gravity or downhill system. However, some areas in the City run on a pump system. While a wipe will eventually break down over time, it will not break down fast enough before entering a pumping station within the City's sewer system and causing damage.

Protect your property and our community's infrastructure by throwing alternative cleaning products in the trash and only flushing the 3 Ps: pee, poo, and paper. To learn more about what to flush visit our website at SantaBarbaraCA.gov/WTF.

ONGOING CHANGES FOR CITY MARBORG CUSTOMERS



MarBorg is replacing existing trash, recycling, and yard waste cans.

During the months of May and June, MarBorg will continue replacing existing trash, recycling, and yard waste cans (non-wheeled) with easy-to-maneuver wheeled carts for City of Santa Barbara customers. The new trash carts are gray to comply with state regulations regarding statewide container colors (SB 1383). Recycling carts will remain blue and yard waste carts will remain green. Beginning July 1, 2025, all customers will need to wheel carts to the curbside on scheduled service day(s). Carts must be wheeled to the curb by 6:00 a.m. on your service day, or no earlier than the night before. Effective July 1, 2025, in-place service will be available for a proposed fee of \$44.89 per month.
