SPRUCE UP YOUR SPRINKLERS



Prepare your irrigation system for summer and catch hidden leaks!

With the hotter months approaching, you may be turning your irrigation system back on or increasing the watering frequency. While doing so, it is important to inspect the valves, sprinkler heads, water lines, and to properly schedule your timer. Following these simple steps now will go a long way towards saving you water and money.

- Ease into Water Flow: When restoring water to your system, be sure to do so slowly. Opening the
 main water valve quickly can cause a high-pressure surge that could result in damaged valves and
 burst fittings. Instead, open the main water valve to the irrigation in a slow and controlled fashion to
 gradually ease water flow and prevent a costly repair.
- Inspect Above-Ground Components: It is important to conduct a visual inspection of the entire
 ground-level portion of your system to ensure sprinkler heads and drip emitters are not obstructed
 in any way. Spray heads that are damaged, buried, and blocked with plants, dirt, or rocks could
 result in an uneven flow of water. Also, be sure to check that valves are not leaking and are turned
 off completely. After a long period of disuse, internal valve seals may dry out and may not seal or
 shut off completely.
- Review and Schedule Your Irrigation Timer: Use the Landscape Watering Calculator found on our website to create a custom watering schedule for your landscape. Then adjust it to the local weather conditions in one easy step with our Weekly Watering % Adjust value found on our website.
- Replace and Upgrade Old Parts: There may be components of your irrigation system that need
 replacement or upgrades to increase efficiency. Most commonly, nozzles and sprinkler heads can
 be retrofitted with newer technology such as rotating nozzles and pressure regulating sprinkler bodies that reduce misting and overspray.

City laboratory staff conduct more than 45,000 water quality tests each year to ensure safe drinking water for our community. As in past years, the City outperformed every state and federal public health standard for water quality. FREE BULKY ITEM PICKUPS FOR CITY OF SANTA BARBARA RESIDENTS

All City of Santa Barbara residents with trash service receive four free "bulky item" pickups (of up to five items, boxes, or bags) each year. Renters are now eligible to schedule bulky item pickups. This includes items like furniture, mattresses, appliances, and more. Yard waste must be securely bagged, tied, and shorter than 5-6 feet in length. Up to two tires can also be included in each pickup (tire only, rims must be removed). Construction or remodeling waste is not accepted. Bulky item pickups must be scheduled in advance. Call MarBorg at (805) 963-1852 to schedule a pickup. Gather items and place them at the curb by 6:00 AM on your scheduled pickup day. Placing items at the curb anytime other than your scheduled pickup day will be treated as illegal dumping.
