



Cabrillo & Los Patos Roundabout Project Fact Sheet

The Cabrillo and Los Patos Roundabout Project included the construction of a single-lane roundabout at the intersection of East Cabrillo Boulevard and Los Patos Way.

The existing two-way, stop-controlled intersection at East Cabrillo and Los Patos Way was heavily traveled by many motorists, bicyclists, and pedestrians. The new roundabout brings much-needed improvements and provides safer travel for all modes of transportation along East Cabrillo Boulevard.

New features include updated crosswalks with traffic islands and a landscaped center island with native and drought tolerant plants. Cyclists can use the roundabout or use the multi-use paths.

This Project is the first phase of the Pedestrian and Bicycle Improvements on East Cabrillo Boulevard and Union Pacific Railroad Bridge Replacement Project, which is located between the new roundabout and Cabrillo Blvd/UPRR Overcrossing.

Project & Community Benefits:

- **Improve traffic flow** and reduce congestion
- Enhance **safety and mobility for all users** — drivers, cyclists, and pedestrians
- Improve **access and connectivity** to and from the Waterfront, Eastside, and Coast Village neighborhoods
- Improve **stormwater drainage systems**

By the Numbers:

- **Project Duration:** Construction of the Roundabout began in **February 2024** and was completed in **May 2025**.
- **Budget:** Project was funded with a mix of State and Federal funds:
 - **Design: \$3,300,000 Construction: \$8,850,000**

What's to Come:

- The second phase of the Project is in final design, which includes the replacement of the existing Union Pacific Railroad Bridge over Cabrillo Boulevard with pedestrian and bicycle improvements. The City collaborated with SBCAG and Caltrans on an SB-1 Cycle 4 grant application to fund construction. The second

phase of the Project will tie into the last phase of the Highway 101 HOV and Widening Project that includes a new highway interchange at Highway 101 and Cabrillo Blvd.
