The following is based on the conversations and deliberations of the Santa Barbara Community Formations Commission during meetings of the full commission, as well as discussions of the Community Feedback Survey Working Group. What is included does not represent the final recommendations. Instead, what follows is a working document of the commission as they move toward creating their draft recommendations and finalizing their community engagement strategies.

#### Focus Group Stakeholder Category List:

The goal of the focus groups is to collect qualitative feedback on our draft recommendation from stakeholder groups that have regular interactions or represent populations that have regular interactions with the SBPD. This list is not representative of all stakeholders but is a starting point for discussion. It should be noted that our capacity for focus groups is limited to 8-10, but the CFC will also be releasing an online and paper survey to gather feedback from the community at large. The organizations listed below each focus group are there to provide context for the category and identify potential partners that can help us reach potential focus group participants.

We know this list is not exhaustive and ask that the Commission help finalize the list of focus groups and contribute ideas regarding which organizations and constituent groups should be a part of each one.
