Committee Questions/Discussion:

Committee members asked questions related to encampment cleanups, access to dumpsters and trash containers when left uncovered; and, how information is received when an enforcement officer responds to a code violation.

Mr. Benson reported that CDC guidance at the beginning of the pandemic was to avoid removing encampments due to higher risk of spreading Covid-19, however recent cleanups were advanced due to fire hazards, threats to water quality, and less risk of disease spread.

Ms. Teaze reported that any dumpsters that are not covered or contained can be reported to the Creeks Division's enforcement hotline; and, that often business owners and residents are lacking the education regarding the effect on water quality and are willing to change their practices once they have been notified.
