a. FISCAL YEAR 2023 BUDGET - For Action

Committee Questions/Discussion:

Committee members asked questions regarding increases in salaries, decreases in Measure B funding due to the pandemic; and, general fund use of Measure B funds.

Mr. Benson reported that the increase in staff salaries is due to increases directed by Council, that although TOT revenue decreased during the pandemic, forecasts show it is currently increasing; and, that usage of funds from Measure B are restricted by the Municipal Code and the funding guidelines of the Division.

b. SOUTHERN COASTAL SANTA BARBARA CREEKS BIOASSESSMENT PROGRAM AND 2021 REPORT – For Discussion

Committee Questions/Discussion:

Committee members asked questions related to an increase in trash due to the pandemic and the impact of different types of trash on water quality, regional watershed collaboration.

Mr. Brinkman reported that although there may be additional sources for trash due to the pandemic, a significant increase was not noted, that while all forms of trash negatively affect water quality, organic pollution can affect oxygen levels which are harmful to aquatic habitats; and, that city and county collaboration combined with private landowner access

have benefitted the program greatly over the years.
