


RFP/RFQ Status

- November 2021: SSAC reviewed draft RFP/Q
- January 6, 2022: RFP/Q available
- January 28, 2022: RFP/Q pre-submittal meeting March 3, 2022: RFP/Q closes
- ~ April May 2022: Interviews and selection
- ~ May June: Contract authorization
- ~ June July 2022: Project kickoff

Summary of ERETO Provisions

- Authorizes the continued closure of State Street
- Businesses can continued the use of expanded outdoor business areas & parklets Citywide until Dec. 31, 2023
- Addresses public health, safety & welfare concerns

 specifically emergency access & circulation
 requirements



Summary of ERETO Provisions

- Establishes 20' Fire lane and 13'6" vertical clearance on Promenade
- Outdoor Business Facilities on State Street Promenade must be "Portable"
- Reopening of partial closed streets
- Outdoor cooking prohibited



Other Street Closures - Access/Circulation Needs

- Emergency Ordinance allowed for other roadway closures on:
 - 00 W. Victoria Block, 1300 State Street, 2 other areas
- The ERETO requires that these roadways be fully reopened by March 8, 2022
- Outdoor business facilities can transition to parklets (~ 5 businesses impacted)



State Street Promenade Emergency Access Requirements

- Current 14.5 foot fire access lane is not compliant
- By March 8, 2022, a 20 foot fire access lane on the Promenade needs to be established
- Requires temporary outdoor business facilities not encroach into the fire access lane (~25 businesses impacted)


STATE ST PROMENADE - TYPICAL FIRE LANE

Additional Promenade Issues

- Uses on roadway have changed (e.g. outdoor dining requires increased cleaning)
- User experience with roadway has changed (driving vs. walking/biking/skateboarding)
- New opportunities for parades, festivals & special events
- Outdoor facility design (e.g. portability) is critical to cleaning and maintenance of Promenade

- ERETO requires outdoor business areas on the Promenade to transition to portable equipment & furnishings
- Portability allows for relocation to accommodate accessibility, parades & special events, storm flows & street cleaning
- Question on transition and timing to require portability




