

## The Paseo Nuevo mall redevelopment is crucial to achieving the community's vision for State Street



- Paseo Nuevo is a key anchor for the City Center District of State Street as a multi-purpose promenade
- Conversion of mostly vacant retail to multifamily housing will bring many more residents to Downtown
- Sends a strong market signal to other developers and investors considering State Street





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
