Dear Mr. Slack and Committee Members,

I am a long-time building contractor and construction specialist in Santa Barbara. I have been in this county my entire life, and I started working in the construction industry in 1993 here in Santa Barbara. I have a degree in Civil Engineering from California Polytechnic University and I am a licensed General Contractor (B) in California. I am also the past Chair and current board member of the chamber of commerce.

I am writing on behalf of the Chaffee family, owners of 726 State St. They consulted me to evaluate the effect of the Washingtonia Robusta at the back of their building which is located at 726 State Street. This tree is on City Property and is growing against the bottom base of their building and is at least 15" up the wall on the back base of the building.

The tree is causing moisture intrusion and will, if it hasn't already, cause degradation of the masonry mortar and concrete foundation. This poses a risk to the structural integrity of the building.

Dear Tree Advisory Officers,

As owners of the 726 State Street/725 De La Guerra Plaza property, we have concern about the palm tree that is growing around the corner of our building. We have had damage to the brick at the base of our building due to moisture to the West of the location of the palm tree which has required mitigation to protect the brick from further erosion/damage. The palm tree in question has grown over the corner of the building and precludes both 1) our ability to assess for moisture damage to the brick; and 2) to mitigate damage done to the brick/structure of our building by moisture over time. For these reasons we feel strongly that the tree should be removed to allow us to appropriately assess and care for our building.
